- Every article exhibited must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

ONIONS must be dried and ready for storage. Peeling too much of the outer shell off will be disqualified. PUMPKINS can be washed but not polished with wax or oils. CARROTS must have 1" tops. All TOMATOES must have their CALYX ATTACHED (stems). Only Entries Worthy of Merit will be awarded cash or prizes. This will be determined solely by our judges and their decision shall be final.
